As children experiment with building structures using magnatiles, they naturally develop skills in pattern formation, recognition of shapes and critical thinking. The process of deciding which tiles to place where and how to connect them fosters logical reasoning and planning, helping children refine their problem-solving skills. Through trial and error, they learn cause-and-effect

Planned Self Review - Diverse Needs
