# **Programme Highlights**

#### Samoan culture

Samoan language week was a time to celebrate and reflect upon the rich Samoan culture in NZ. The children engaged in a number of creative projects such as painting Samoan patterns using stencils, adding to our collaborative siapo bark cloth started last year, making traditional ula lei necklaces made of flowers and shells and decorative tuiga or ceremonial crowns. We watched traditional Samoan dancing and made our own drumming music. We enjoyed reading stories rich in Samoan language and culture, collected natural 'treasures' in atu (baskets) and played in our fale (house).

# **Communication Corner**

Connections with home: An important part of our early childhood curriculum is making connections with our children's home life. We do this is many ways including sharing news from home, celebrating birthdays, sharing our cultures, bringing pets in to visit and welcoming family into kindergarten through events such as our Dad's sausage sizzle, grandparents day and our family disco. We encourage families to share significant milestones, events and people in your child's life with us at kindy.

Building Independence: Our kindergarten programme supports children to build independence as an important skill in preparing them for school and becoming active and valued members of our community. There are many ways in which we foster this independence such as encouraging our children to name their art work, taking their shoes on and off and teaching them to go to the toilet and eat their lunch independently. Parent's can support this also by encouraging children to dress themselves, put their own shoes on, walking into kindergarten independently, putting their lunch box into the basket and ensuring that children wear clothing and shoes at kindergarten that they can manage independently.

Emergency Information for Parents: On the recommendation of the Ministry of Education we maintain a document that provides information to parents about what happens if an emergency situation arises at kindy. This document is reviewed and updated annually and shared with our kindergarten community. Full details of our emergency management procedures are contained in our Emergency Management Plan and relevant Health and Safety policies which are reviewed regularly and available for parents to review.

Policies: Review of centre policies are carried out monthly on a rotational basis. This month we reviewed our Body Washing, Hand Washing and Parental Involvement with minimal change. All policies are available for review and feedback by our parent community.

Greeting of the month: The greeting of the month for July is the French greeting Bonjour.
