Programme Highlights

Our Kindy Pepeha

We are continuing our efforts in increasing the use of Te Reo Maori at kindy and one of the ways we have been doing this over the last few months is by supporting our tamariki in learning our kindy Pepeha. A Pepeha is a Māori way of introducing yourself by sharing your connections with people and places.

Learning our kindy Pepeha allows tamariki to build on their sense of belonging and to learn more about themselves as tangata whenua or tangata tiriti. Learning the Pepeha is also a great way for tamariki to learn and share more about their own culture and heritage. Tamariki have been very interested in learning our kindy Pepeha

along with the actions and are becoming more and more confident in getting up in front of their peers at mat time to lead this. Consistent with sharing our karakia at meal times we hope that all children over time will develop the confidence and ability to do lead our Pepeha.

Drawing

We have some very talented artists at kindy so as a team we have been focusing on providing children with lots of opportunities to engage in drawing activities and to extend this interest. We are offering opportunities for drawing in lots of different areas throughout the kindergarten and setting up different provocations to draw children's attention and

terest.

The children have been making treasure maps using tea stained paper, drawing faces, their families, fairies and dragons, flags, insects, animals and even full body drawings in our Wise Owls programme. We have set up drawing spaces outside in the playground and collaborative drawing opportunities on the concrete. We have also provided a variety of drawing mediums such as colouring pens, felts, white board markers, chalk, charcoal and even our fingers for our Dad's Father's Day cards. Difference drawing platforms have also been used such as paper, whiteboards, chalk boards, chalkboards and glass.

Cultural Day

This month we celebrated our annual Cultural Day and were very lucky to have a wonderful sunny day to share with our families. We celebrated the many cultures within our kindergarten community by wearing some wonderful traditional costumes and participating in singing and dancing from around the world.

We enjoyed some traditional cultural activities such as Māori weaving, building Thai stupas, making play dough flags and creating Indian mandela patterns with recycled bottle tops. We

were creative by enjoying tapa cloth painting, Sri Lankan earthy mandela paintings, decorating Irish clovers at the collage table and making All Blacks jerseys and English swords and shields. Miss Rasmussen shared her Danish culture by introducing us to a game of Slå katten af tønden, a barrel filled with treasures to retrieve. We also tasted some delicious new flavours through the sharing of cultural food. It was a true celebration and learning of all our cultures at kindy.
